- (1) High Tech Addition -- Our library branch now has a new self-check-out machine! It's super easy to use and is located by the circulation desk. With this machine you can check out books, pick up holds (ask the circulation desk for your items first), and pay bills. Payment is by credit or debit card only. The machine also has another helpful function. If you print something from one of the library's computers, you can pick up your printed materials at the machine using a credit card. (For cash payments, patrons can continue to use the printer located near the public internet computers.) See images of the new check-out station attached to this email.

This book is inspired by the true events of the Moonlight Schools.

May 27, 2021 at 10:30 a.m. -- This short discussion will focus on "Rope" by Katherine Anne Porter. This story is about the tensions between a husband and wife which escalates when a coil of rope and forgotten coffee reveal hidden frustrations.

May 12, 2021 at 2:00 p.m. -- Join Nicholas Wood, Resource Interpretive Specialist-Historic Resources, Twin Lights Historic Site, Division of Parks & Forestry for a virtual exploration of the history of the

Twin Lights Lighthouse along with other notable historical events in and around the Navesink Highlands.

May 13, 2021 at 7:00 p.m. -- Join Dick Evans, a San Francisco-based photographer, Kathy Chin Leong, a career journalist, and Gregory Yen, an Asian-American pharmacist and lawyer, to commemorate Asian/Pacific-American Heritage Month. This presentation will feature a dynamic slide show with commentary showcasing Mr. Evan's and Ms. Chin Leong's book "From Resilience to Celebration: An In-Depth, Virtual Pictorial Journey Inside San Francisco's beloved Chinatown." It brings to life the history, culture, tourism and traditions of Chinatown and its residents who have proven to be resilient against all odds.

May 18, 2021 at 7:00 p.m. -- Join Jennifer W. Reiss (who holds a Master's in history from Cambridge University, a JD from Harvard University, and is a PhD candidate in history at the University of Pennsylvania) as she explores the life of Gouverneur Morris, one our nation's founding fathers, a signer of both the Articles of Confederation and the U.S. Constitution, author of the preamble to the Constitution, envoy to France during the French Revolution, and senator from New York. Morris was one of the most outspoken critics of slavery among the Founding Fathers and also argued for the right of people to practice their own religion without interference. Ms. Reiss highlights how Morris negotiated his multiple physical disabilities (his left leg was amputated after a carriage accident and he was severely burned on his right side) alongside class and gender expectations in the early days of our republic.

May 19, 2021 at 10:30 a.m. -- Find out how they partied hearty in the Middle Ages through this virtual art history lecture by Michael Norris of Armchair Art Tours. Despite the Middle Ages being viewed by some as the "Dark Ages," people in that era often enjoyed good times, especially at the table. Through art and archeology learn about medieval foods and their preparations (including a recipe for roast unicorn!!), as well as the rules and ceremonies under which these foods were presented and the types of entertainment guests might enjoy. Works from the Museum of Art and the Met's Cloisters Museum will highlight this presentation.

May 20, 2021 at 7 p.m. -- Archivist, educator and photographer Gary Saretzky presents a virtual lecture on 19th century New Jersey photographer, Gustavus Pach. The most successful photographer in Long Branch in the 19th century, Pach began photographing Long Branch from a mobile wagon in 1866 and opened a gallery there the following year. Pach is highly regarded for hundreds of scenic stereo views of Monmouth County and many of his glass negatives are at the Monmouth County Historical Association.
